While many green hotels in the Caribbean tend to fall on the more rustic eco-lodge side of the spectrum, [Hotel Manapany](#) is a true luxury hotel—not too surprising, given its location on the tony island of [St. Barts](#). Opened in 2018, the 43-room hotel is nestled into a hillside that rises from the beach, just five minutes from the airport and St. Jean and 10 minutes from Gustavia. As far as sustainability goes, the hotel generates much of its electricity from solar panels, it produces its own water, and only electric cars are permitted on the property. Additionally, rooms aren't cleaned with harsh chemicals, but with steam and natural products. And finally, the hotel has a robust garden that produces fruits and veggies for the restaurant, which is an impressive feat given the fact that the island is arid and has no natural water source.
